#### Who is Mobile Health?<sup>1</sup>

## What services are available through the GHX/Mobile Health scheduling portal?

Commonly required vaccines, titers, and drug tests for facility access, such as:

- Varicella vaccine/titer
- MMR vaccine/titer
- Hepatitis B vaccine/titer
- One-step QuantiFERON Tuberculosis blood test
- 5 different drug screen panel options

### Where can I find Mobile Health screening locations? 1

During the ordering process, a zip code search will identify the closest location for your visit.

#### Can I schedule appointments online?

Yes, you can conveniently schedule an appointment online by visiting <a href="https://ghx.mobilehealth.com">https://ghx.mobilehealth.com</a>.

#### How long does it take to get results?1

Most test results are returned within 2-3 business days.

#### Can I expedite or rush my testing?<sup>1</sup>

No, but next day appointments are available.

#### How do I receive results?

Results will be sent directly to your email provided during the ordering process.

## Do I need to bring a form of personal identification to my appointment?1

Yes, any of the following forms of identification are accepted: Driver's License, State ID, Passport, Employment Authorization Card, Green Card.

#### Can I use my insurance?<sup>1</sup>

You can pay for services with a credit card, FSA/HSA credit/debit card or regular debit card. Receipts are available should you need them for insurance reimbursement.

### Will I still need to upload documents to my **Vendormate profile to fulfill requirements?**

Yes, you will need to submit documents such as proof of immunization for MMR, Varicella, TB, Hepatitis B, Influenza, and/or documentation of a completed drug screening, such as a letter of attestation from your current employer or a note from a physician or nurse. The "Final Report" you receive from Mobile Health can be accepted for most lab-based requirements.

**Note:** We value your confidentiality; therefore, we do not accept drug screen results. You may need to upload specific pages from this report for drug screen requirements.

## What are the different drug panel options? 2



5-panel, 7-panel, 8-panel, 9-panel, and 10-panel.

**Note:** Healthcare facilities and employers set their own policies for drug screening, which may include screening for marijuana. The number of panels (substances) that are requested to be tested may vary. Please be sure to refer to the specific requirements of each facility.

## What is the difference between a vaccine and a titer? 2

A vaccine builds immunity against viruses, while a titer measures antibody levels in your blood to assess immunity. Titer tests help you decide if you need a vaccination, saving you time if you're unsure about your vaccination history or unable to locate previous records.

#### What is QuantiFERON-TB Gold titer? 3,4

The QuantiFERON-TB Gold titer is a simple blood test that aids in the detection of Mycobacterium tuberculosis, the bacteria which causes tuberculosis (TB). Unlike the PPD TB skin test, it can be completed in just one office visit versus two.

#### What is respirator fit testing?<sup>5,6</sup>

Fit testing is the method of finding the right size respirator. Employees working a position that is regulated by OSHA Respirator Standard CFR 1910.134 are required to have a respirator fit testing done at least once a year.
